The Reverend Joseph Stratton, a long-time minister from 1843 until 1903, and the Turning Angel, a statuary that has become the symbol of the historic Natchez City Cemetery, will be your guides.

Natchez itself is centuries years old, and its history is long and colorful, partly due to its strategic location along the mighty Mississippi River and the Natchez Trace.

This old river brought many influences to our town, among them European, African, Asian, Jewish, Catholic, and Protestant.

Some saints, some sinners, heroes and harlots, generals, gamblers, eccentrics, and the elite.

These acres hold thousands of stories, both well-known and untold.

A visit to Natchez is not complete without a tour of the Natchez City Cemetery.

Established in 1822 on the bluffs high above the Mississippi River, the beautiful grounds provide breathtaking views of the Mississippi River — never more striking than at sunset. In addition to the wonderful stories, this tour provides an amazing view of masterful ironwork and monuments.


